October 10, 2010	28th Sunday in Ordinary Time
2 Kgs 5:14-17 2 Tim 2:8-13 Luke 17:11-19	Naaman, cured of leprosy, offers a gift to Elisha, then solicits earth from Israel. The word of God is not chained. I suffer for the chosen and for faithfulness. Out of ten cured lepers, only one, a Samaritan, returns to thank Jesus.
October 17, 2010	29th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Exod 17:8-13 2 Tim 3:14-4:2 Luke 18:1-8	As long as Moses' hands were raised, Israel prevailed over Amalek in the battle. All scripture is inspired by God, and useful for teaching and correction. The parable of the dishonest judge and the persistent widow.
October 24, 2010	30th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Sir 35:12-14, 16-18 2 Tim 4:6-8, 16-18 Luke 18:9-14	The Lord knows no favorites, hearing the prayer of the lowly and the oppressed. The time of my end is near. Though no one took my part, the Lord stood by me. The parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector.
October 31, 2010	31st Sunday in Ordinary Time
Wis 11:22-12:2 2 Thess 1:11-2:2 Luke 19:1-10	Before God, the universe is a drop, yet you love and spare all you have made! We pray always for your worthiness. Don't be alarmed by rumors of the endtime. Jesus meets Zacchaeus, the wealthy tax collector.
November 1	All Saints Day
Rev 7:2-4,9-14 1 John 3:1-3 Matt 5:1-12a	I saw a multitude, from all nations, wearing white and standing before the throne. We are God's children now. Later, we shall be like him, for we shall see him. The Beatitudes
November 7, 2010	32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time
2 Macc 7:1-2, 9-14 2 Thess 2:16-3:5 Luke 20:27-38 or 20:27, 34-38	Despite torture, the seven brothers and their mother defy King Antiochus. May God encourage you. Pray for our preaching and safety. God is faithful. Master, which of the seven brothers will be married to the widow in the next life?
November 14, 2010	33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time
Mal 3:19-20a 2 Thess 3:7-12 Luke 21:5-19	On that day, the evil will burn away, but the good will feel the sun of justice. Among you, we earned our keep. Imitate us. Keep busy, not idle and interfering. There will be signs and strife, but first persecution and betrayal. Persevere!
November 21, 2010	Christ the King
2 Sam 5:1-3 Col 1:12-20 Luke 23:35-43	The tribal commanders proclaim David the new king of Israel. Thank God, our deliverer, and Jesus, his image, the head of the church. Jesus, crucified, converses with the two criminals crucified with him.
November 28, 2010	1st Sunday of Advent (Year A)
Isaiah 2:1-5 Romans 13:11-14 Matthew 24:37-44	All peoples shall stream to the Lord's mountain, for instruction, judgment and peace. The night is spent. The day draws near. Cast off dark deeds and put on light. As in Noah's day, sudden will be the coming of the Son of Man. Stay awake!
December 5, 2010	2nd Sunday of Advent
Isaiah 11:1-10 Romans 15:4-9 Matthew 3:1-12	A shoot shall sprout from Jesse. The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him. Christ served the Jews because of God's faithfulness. The Gentiles glorify God's mercy. John appeared in the desert, saying: "Reform your lives! The reign of God is at hand!"
December 8 (Wed)	Immaculate Conception of Mary
Genesis 3:9-15, 20 Ephesians 1:3-6, 11-12 Luke 1:26-38	I will put enmity between you and the woman, between your seed and her seed. God chose and blessed us in Christ to praise his glory. Hail, full of grace! / I am the servant of the Lord!
December 12, 2010	3rd Sunday of Advent
Isaiah 35:1-6a, 10 James 5:7-10 Matthew 11:2-11	The desert shall bloom. Eyes and ears will be opened. The lame will leap like a stag. Be patient, as a farmer awaiting his yield, as the prophets who spoke for God. "Are you the one to come?" "The blind see, lepers are cured, the poor hear good news."
